An international conference on planning the future for regional health care in 2025

Health systems in today's world are facing unprecedented pressures, a combination of meeting the health needs of ageing populations and the related rise in chronic illness, costly technological advances, legacy problems caused by underinvestment in modernizing health facilities and patient demand driven by better information and less healthy lifestyles.

This is taking place at a time when governments across Europe are implementing austerity measures in public service spending to help manage a fragile and uncertain economic outlook. Health is often in the forefront of the slow down in public spending and capital investment. This situation is unlikely to ease anytime soon.

Many governments are now considering major reform of healthcare as a necessary next step, in particular moving on from what has been described as a hospital-centric model of service delivery to an integrated system that improves whole systems cohesion and collaboration between the acute hospital, primary care and social care services.

A notable feature of 'change in action' is the increasing move towards regionalization to give greater autonomy to local government and healthcare organisations to improve responsiveness and accountability for meeting these challenges.

New EU legislation will also impact on healthcare systems. From October 2013 member states must implement a directive on patients rights in cross border care. This will make it easier for patients to be insured in one country and access treatment in another. Rights will also include better access to information on quality of treatment and comparison of conditions across several hospitals.

The Aalto conference aims to bring together key players at the forefront of changing healthcare and implementing regionally focused strategies.

The topics covered will include:

- The changing context of healthcare delivery
- How health strategies, systems and new models of care are responding to the need for reform
- The impact on hospital planning and architecture
- How change is being implemented and the new challenges for managers and professionals
- Response to the EU cross border care legislation
- A look towards the future and what may lie just over the horizon
- Above all the conference will be evidence-based, draw on the experience of leading managers, professionals, planners and analysts.
