



Total bed numbers	The new ward constitutes 60 beds, 48 for rehabilitation and a 12 bedded unit within Day Surgery. The beds within day surgery are available to medics to extend the range of short stay surgical procedures offered to patients. The beds, known as “23-hour” beds are for patients who need a short spell of recovery time following day treatment such as day surgery.


Departmental information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Endoscopy unit provides a full range of services including Upper GI endoscopy, colonoscopy and bronchoscopy. The unit also provides a one stop rapid access rectal bleeding service. ▪ The advanced Day Surgery Suite has six theatres. ▪ There is state of the art equipment available within the Imaging Department. It is used for those patients requiring x-rays, CT/MRI and Ultrasound scans and barium enemas. ▪ The Ophthalmology Department provides outpatient services to both adults and children. These services include specialist diabetic and laser clinics, specialist corneal clinics and specialist oculoplastic clinics. ▪ The facility boasts state of the art equipment from the latest MRI scanners to operating theatre technologies delivering clean air filtration systems and wall screens showing x-ray images.




SITE PLAN






FIRST FLOOR PLAN






SECOND FLOOR PLAN






THIRD FLOOR PLAN






ATRIUM ROOF DETAIL
